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ALL SAINTS SOLEMNITY

What is All Saints' Day? All Saints' Day celebrates the feast or solemnity of all the saints in Heaven, both saints recognized by the Church as holy men and women and those who remain unknown.

When is All Saints' Day? Usually on 1st November but this year it is transferred to Sunday 2nd of November and so All Souls' Day is also moved to Monday 3rd November.

What is the difference between All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day? All Saints' Day celebrates the holy men and women in Heaven, those known and unknown by the Church, whereas All Souls' Day honours all of the faithful departed.

When did All Saints' Day start? Pope Boniface IV instituted All Saints' Day in the Church in 609 when the Roman temple of the Pantheon in Rome became a Church named the Basilica of St. Mary and the Martyrs.

Recent Saint: Pope Leo XIV will officially proclaim Saint John Henry Newman, the most recently canonised saint from England and Wales, the 38th Doctor of the Church during Mass on Saturday 1st November.

Mass for the Faithful Departed: Mass will be celebrated for all the Faithful Departed on Monday 3rd November -All Souls' Day at 7pm at which we will invite families who have had funerals in the parish in the last year.

St Peregrine Icon: St Peregrine is the patron saint of those with cancer and chronic health conditions. Fr Stephen and three parishioners visited Hyning Hall Monastery where Sr Stella is designing and painting a unique icon for the church. It will have some unique features such as the river Mersey and the sea, our church showing healing is at work today, the saint will hold healing herbs in one hand and a pot of ointment in the other to show his ministry as a healer. A cross around his neck as he works in the name of Christ. We look forward to receiving this icon which will be a catalyst to talk about cancer, to have services of healing and to give people a focus during difficult days.

The procession for Holy Communion:

1. Please do not all stand up at once and start moving.
2. The front row moves first then the second and so on....
3. Those unable to join the communion procession, Holy Communion will be brought to you in the front benches. Thank you for making the Eucharist procession prayerful and not like being in a queue at the Post Office.

Aisles: The aisles of the church are for processions, especially the Eucharistic procession to receive Holy Communion. Secondly, aisles need to be kept clear in case we need to leave the church quickly. Space has been created in two places at the front of the church for wheelchairs, prams and walking aids.

Anne Cooney, Dr Mutukwa Mutukwa, and Colin Sibbald took part in training last week. We ask the Lord to bless them in the ministry they now begin and thank them for their generosity in service.
