SS Peter and Paul Day: It is difficult to think items. of two men more different from each other in history and vocation than Saint Peter and Paul were. Yet, not only are they both remembered as two bulwarks of faith, and symbols of the Catholic Church itself. Although it is almost certain that both Peter and Paul suffered martyrdom by the will of Nero, the first crucified upside down, the second beheaded between 64 A.D. and 67 A.D., the fact that the two killings took place on the same day of the same year is highly unlikely. It is more plausible that the choice to commemorate the death of both Saints Peter and Paul on 29th June derives from the desire to convert a pagan feast into a Christian celebration, as has happened over the centuries for many other religious holidays. In fact, June 29th coincided with the feast of Romulus and Remus, founders of Rome. Christians have probably wished to pay homage to the two founders of the Church on that same day, as if to celebrate the birth of a new Christian Rome. Happy feast!

Seminarian: Next week Rhys Jones will be introducing himself at Masses. Rhys will be on a pastoral placement in the parish. He is discerning priesthood and is studying at Allen Hall seminary, Chelsea.

Assisted Suicide: The Cardinal and Archbishop Sherrington have written "Our Parliament has now rejected amendments that would have allowed such institutions not to be involved in assisted suicide. In other words, a right to assisted suicide given to individuals is highly likely to become a duty on care homes and hospices to facilitate it. We fear that this Bill will thereby seriously affect the provision of social care and palliative care across the country. Institutions whose mission has always been to provide compassionate care in sickness or old age, and to provide such care until the end of life, may have no choice, in the face of these demands, but to withdraw from the provision of such care. Many Catholic hospices provide services for large proportions of our cities. Withdrawal from the sector could create enormous problems for the provision of palliative care just at the time when the provision of palliative care needs to be invested in and strengthened."
